Make sure there are enough spaces in the schools,
so we don't have to travel too far.

A good teacher is kind.

Motivates and challenges us to do even better.

Includes what's important to us in their lessons.

Makes time for us (during and after lessons).

Offers structure and safety,
without being too controlling, trusts us.
